ARTICLE I	
Name and Place of Business	
1. The Association shall be known as Persatuan Kajian Obesiti Malaysia [Malaysian Association for the Study of Obesity] (PEKOM / MASO).	
2. Its registered place of business shall be at Faculty of Health Sciences, Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia, Jalan Raja Muda Abdul Aziz, 50300 Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia, or at such place or places as may from time to time be decided on by the Council; and its postal address shall be as above or such other address as may from time to time be decided on by the Council. The registered place of business of the Association shall not be changed without the prior approval of the Registrar of Societies).	
3. There shall be a Patron of the Association who will be appointed at a General Meeting of the Association

## d. Honorary members:

Distinguished persons who have rendered notable service to the Association or to the understanding of obesity may on the recommendation of the Council be elected as Honorary members by a majority vote at a General Meeting.

## e. Fellow members:

Fellow members shall be elected at a General Meeting, on the recommendation of the Council for outstanding professional and meritorious contribution to the field of obesity. Fellows of the Association will be entitled to use the abbreviation, FMASO, after their names.

4.2	The Council may co-opt suitable referees to review the proposal.	4.2 An application must be made through the Coordinator (lecturer in charge) of the Community Project together with a detailed proposal of the programme.
4.3	The research grant shall consist of a cash award not exceeding Three Hundred Ringgit for undergraduate and not exceeding Five Hundred Ringgit (RM500) for postgraduate student.	4.3 The grant shall be in cash not exceeding One Thousand Ringgit (RM1000).
		4.4 The Association shall award not more than two grants per calendar year.
